Minutes from the Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2019

at Burgh Castle Village Hall

**Present:** Cllrs B Swan (Chair), B. Grimmer, J. Hogg, M Greenacre, P. Carter, W. Griffiths, K. Palmer (Clerk), and 35 members of the public including Borough Cllr Myers and County Cllr Smith.

# The public section commenced at 7.30pm PUBLIC SECTION

- -The Chairman reported the sad news that former Parish Council Vice Chairman Eric Foster has passed away. Mr Foster served on the Parish Council for approximately 17 years and will be greatly missed. A minutes silence followed.
- -Following the recent heavy rainfall the previous weekend it has reported there had been significant flooding effecting some properties in Hilldrop Cottages. A recording of the flooding to the rear of the properties has been provided which will be passed onto the Clerk and County Cllr Smith who will report to NCC Highways that all the drains from Folkes Pit down to Hill Drop Cottages, and also Mill Road, need cleaning / pumping.
- -It was reported there is a great amount of silt the length Lords Lane which needs clearing.
- -County Cllr Smith confirmed he will be report all drain issues to Paul Sellick, Highways Engineer.
- -Cllr Myers reported the GYBC Plan 2020-2025 is being developed with a great amount of detail, he will report relevant issues from it as it develops.

With no further business the main meeting commenced at 7.39

#### 1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence had been received from Cllr Nichols. To accept the apology Cllr Swan, Seconded Cllr Grimmer. All In Favour.

The meeting was reopened at 7.41pm for members of public to voice comments in connection relating to the follow planning applications:

# 3. WELCOME PIT PLANNING APPLICATIONS

-FUL/2019/0040 Welcome Pit- Variation of Conditions to allow operational area to serve northern extension

<u>-FUL/2019/0039 Welcome Pit – Northern extension to pit. with extraction of gravel and sand.</u> Agent Mr Stephen Dawe addressed the meeting to outline both planning applications.

Mr Dawe reported the current permission is due to end in 2025 however building sand which is extracted from the site has already run out which is why the application is being applied for.

As a condition of the application if granted would include improvements to the sites access such as new road markings and a vehicle activated speed warning sign. Also all heavy goods activity (hiring of equipment) would be suspended from the site if the application is granted.

The restoration scheme (nature conservation area) includes landscape planting, reed beds open water. The application would supply aggregate to the local area and secure the jobs of 13 members of staff.

# At 7.50pm the meeting was again closed

Members voiced concern that it was thought road improvements had previously been agreed with a previous application but had not been implemented such as a wheel cleaning grid at the entrance to the site and a wheel wash. It was reported from a previous application NCC Highways had stated the site was not adequate.

Therefore the vote was taken to object to both planning applications Yes: 5, Abstain:1. Carried. It was agreed to add a note with the objection that should the applications be approved, it would be expected that the heavy plant vehicle activity is suspended and that site access improvements were made with in 6 months as stated within the meeting.

06/19/0369/F Welcome Farm, Butt Lane Touring glamping site including 12 shepherd huts It was agreed not to submit any comment for the above application.

#### 4. MINUTES FROM LAST MEETING

The Chairman reported he had undertaken a check of the Parish Council bank statements, invoices, payment sheet and cheques. All was found to be in good order with no concerns raised.

<u>Parking Restrictions Consultation</u> -Following the consultation with neighbouring properties at Butt lane opposite to Yare Valley Holiday Park a objection had been received from three property owners stating they did not want double yellow lines added to the area in question. It was confirmed as the objections had been received the work will not be undertaken.

- -County Cllr Smith confirmed he will again speak to the Manager of the Holiday park asking for the hedge to be cut back further.
- --County Cllr Smith stated he will speak to Highways about installing double yellow lines along the High Rd/Butt Lane 'T' junction.

#### 8. VILLAGE SIGN – BENCH & PLANTING OF TREES & FLOWER BEDS

The Chairman reported after placing an advert in the Village Voice no volunteers have come forward to undertake the planting. To cover the immediate time Mrs Swan has agreed to plant some winter bedding plants. It was agreed a maximum spend of up to £35 can be made on the plants. -Cllr Grimmer gave thanks to Borough Cllr Myers for managing to get the bench put in place. More help is needed to look after the flowerbeds in the future.

<u>06/19/0552/F The Gannel, High Rd</u> Extension to respite centre

<u>06/18/0545/O</u> Butt Lane, <u>Dovedale (land rear of)</u> 30 dwellings with garages and access road The following concerns were voiced.

Drains already not coping, will be made worse by a large development. Development is outside of development plan. Natural England and NCC Highways have already objected to a smaller development so why would they support a larger one. The area should remain as natural, agricultural land.

Carried. It was agreed to add the comment that councillors would like to see a section of footpath along Mill Rd frontage the property.

It was agreed to submit no objections subject to neighbours comments for the application above.

<u>06/19/0552/F The Gannel, High Rd</u> Extension to respite centre

It was agreed to submit no objections subject to neighbours comments for the application above. It was agreed to note the following concern that the plans do not show the 6 agreed new properties to the rear of the site and therefore not a true representation of probable outcome.

<u>06/18/0545/O</u> Butt Lane, Dovedale (land rear of) 30 dwellings with garages and access road It was agreed by all members to object to the application above. The proposed development is outside the Borough Development Plan. Highways concerns including dangerous access to the site, inadequate splay, width of road, it is not wide enough there is a bus stop and residents parking in the area. Water and sewer services would not be able too cope with a large development. Natural England have already objected on the previous smaller development application.

The following applications have been granted:

06/19/0267/F Burgh Castle Nursery, Mill Rd Demolition of building & erection of new dwelling

06/19/0486/F Holly Lodge, High Rd Rear extension and front porch 06/19/0478/F Threeways, Butt Lane Rear extension and new garage

06/19/0485/F Threeways, Butt Lane Detached bungalow

The chairman commented that this was against the views of the Parish Council and Councillor

Myers will enquire why this was treated as a 'delegated matter' rather than being taken to committee at the Borough Council in the light of the parish objections.
